

## **TEN BROECK CENTER VISITATION FACT SHEET:**

- **All visitors will be screened for signs and symptoms for COVID-19.** Entry will be denied for those with signs or symptoms or those who have had close contact with someone with COVID-19 infection in the prior 14 days (regardless of vaccination status).
- Hand hygiene must be performed before and after visitation and between contact with residents (use of alcohol-based hand rub is preferred).
- The use of surgical masks is required, the facility will provide if needed.
- Social distancing of at least six feet between persons is expected.
- There will be no more than two visitors at a time per each resident.
- Outdoor visitation is always preferred, even when the resident and visitor are fully vaccinated\* against COVID-19.
- **Any residents in quarantine, whether vaccinated or unvaccinated, are not eligible for visits until they have met criteria for release from quarantine.** This includes those on a 14 day admission quarantine, and those on quarantine due to an exposure or positive result.
- Visitation will occur in our adult day center or outdoors and will be scheduled in advance through our receptionist or on our website.
- Visitation will be limited to half hour time slots to allow for infection prevention protocols to be followed, cleaning, sanitizing and accommodate for the most amount of visits.
- Residents will be brought to adult day, visitors should not be wandering the building.
- If a visitor tests positive for COVID-19 and has visited the facility within 2 days of their positive result or onset of symptoms they must notify the facility immediately so we can conduct contact tracing.
- **The facility encourages all visitors to be fully vaccinated and/or tested for covid-19(PCR or Antigen within 3-5 days of visit) before a visit.**
- The facility is not eligible for visits during the initial phase of outbreak testing. For example, if a resident or staff member tests positive visits will be suspended until the facility can conduct testing on all residents to make sure COVID-19 did not spread to another unit. The facility would notify families of such and let them know when visitation will resume.
- **There will be no food or drinks during visitation to maintain infection control standards.**
- Documentation must include the following for each visitor to the nursing home: first and last name of the visitor; physical (street) address of the visitor; daytime and evening telephone number; date and time of visit; and email address, if available.
- **INFECTION CONTROL GUIDELINES WILL BE FOLLOWED FOR SAFETY!**

*\*\*Fully vaccinated refers to a person who is greater than 14 days following receipt of the second dose in a 2-dose series, or greater than 14 days following receipt of one dose of a single-dose vaccine, per the CDC's Public Health Recommendations for vaccinated persons.*

**Per NYS Department of Health: Visitors who are unable to adhere to the core principles of COVID-19 infection prevention will not be permitted to visit or will be asked to leave.**
